#### Green Flag

Partly through the efforts of the Friends, Vauxhall Park has been short listed for the prestigious Green Flag Award.

The Green Flag Award is the national standard for parks and green spaces in England and Wales. The award scheme began in 1996 as a means of recognising and rewarding the best green spaces in the country. It was also seen as a way of encouraging others to achieve the same high environmental standards, creating a benchmark of excellence in recreational green areas.

Winning a Green Flag Award brings excellent publicity. Both the media and the public are becoming increasingly aware that a site flying a Green Flag is a high quality green space. For more information, visit their website – www.greenflagaward.gov.uk

Currently in Lambeth, only one other green space has the award – Milkwood Open Space. If Vauxhall Park won this award, it would become a 'jewel in the crown' of Lambeth's open spaces. This would be a huge achievement.

The Green Flag inspectors will pay unannounced preview visits in April and/or May, and the actual judging will be in June. Fingers crossed, and we will let you know the outcome.



### Improvements to the Park

The Parks Dept have recently undertaken a wide-ranging programme of improvements, many of them quite small in themselves but adding up to a major transformation in the park's appearance. These include new railings and kerbstones, re-surfacing of paths, removal of dead trees, improved perimeter security, a facelift for the One O'Clock Club and new planting schemes at the two main entrances. Also, the roof of the One O'Clock Club has been replaced following the havoc wreaked by the big storm in January. We are encouraging the Parks Dept to carry out several further improvements which would provide quick wins at low cost – watch this space!

One area of the park which is of continuing concern to the Friends is the Lavender Garden. The turf was unfortunately laid in the very hot and dry summer of 2003; it has never properly 'taken' and large areas are now weed-infested. We are working with the Council to try and find a low-cost but satisfactory solution to this difficult problem.

### **Memorial Benches and Trees**

The installation of four memorial benches last December will be followed by a further two in the next few months, and hopefully two new cherry trees as well. These are both wonderful ways of providing a lasting memorial to a loved one and the Friends are extremely grateful to the donors for their generous gifts.
