#### Cafe Parco is now Open

Hooray! After many years of protracted negotiations, and much hard work by our former Chairman Ivan McCracken in particular, Café Parco opened in September. Pop in and see - there is a fantastic range of coffees, ice-creams, sandwiches and cakes to choose from.

The welcoming proprietor, Henri Laghi, has landscaped the surrounding area, successfully giving a focus to the Fentiman Road/South Lambeth Road corner of the park.

#### The Fountain

Many of you will have noticed that the fountain has been turned off. As a cost-cutting exercise, and to widespread criticism in the local press, Lambeth Council has turned off <u>all</u> the fountains in its parks and public spaces.

We are working hard to try and reverse this decision, and a petition to the Council is currently available in Café Parco - please add your name and sign this before the end of November, when we shall present it to the Council.

On the upside, the Friends are going to use this opportunity to renovate and re-paint the fountain so that when it <u>is</u> re-commissioned, as it surely will be, it will be brighter and better than before.

#### **Green Flag Award for Vauxhall Park**

We are delighted to report that Vauxhall Park has for the second year running been awarded a Green Flag, confirming its status as a park of outstanding quality.

Vauxhall Park is one of only three green spaces in Lambeth to receive this prestigious award and it is a great tribute to all involved with the park - the Friends, the Parks Department and their contractors Veolia - and confirms that our park continues to meet the exacting national standard of excellence.

This could not have been achieved without the commitment and enthusiasm of our gardeners, Richard and George, who make our park such a pleasant place in which to walk, sit and play.

#### **New Gates on Fentiman Road**

The new gates on Fentiman Road have now been installed. They are modelled on the original gates at the main entrances and provide a far grander looking entrance than the previous "temporary" gates – temporary, that is, since 1945. The gates were funded by a generous donor who wishes to remain anonymous but to whom we are immensely grateful.

We are always extremely thankful for any donations, large or small, as they enable us to carry out many of the projects that we have planned for the park.

One such project that we are working on is Phases 2 and 3 of the railing replacement programme, Phase 2 consisting of new railings along the South Lambeth Road perimeter, to match those already installed along the Fentiman Road.
