#### The Bondway Octave Tower

Although we always welcome new users of the park, the FOVP are objecting to the proposed development of a 140m high tower block on the Bondway site at Vauxhall Cross as we believe that this building will cause a detrimental shadow over the central grassy area in the evenings and will loom large over the park,

affecting people's enjoyment of a precious piece of open space in an area where access to quality amenity area is vital for many people. The planning application is the subject of a planning inquiry to be held at the Town Hall, Acre Lane, Brixton from 20th July.
